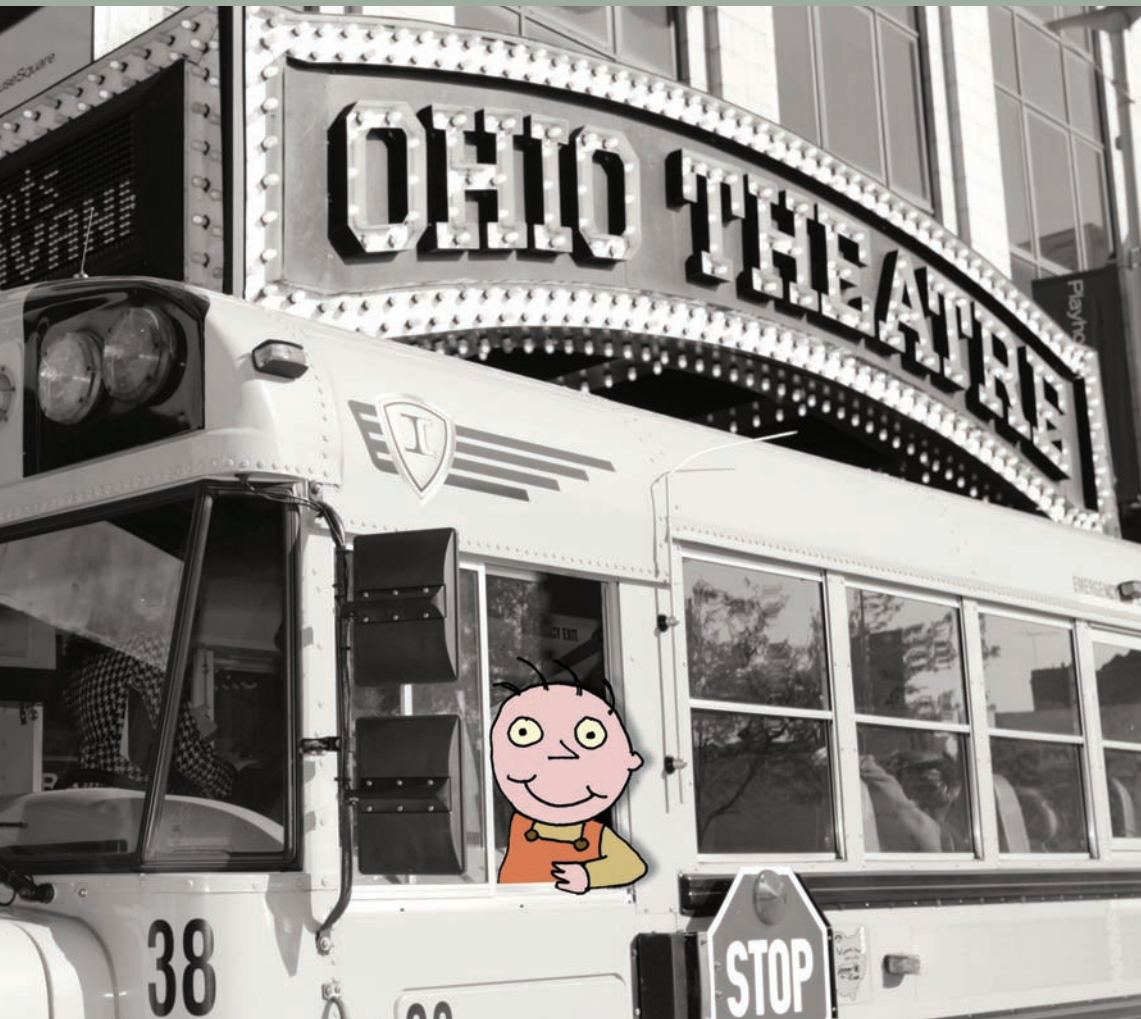

Recommended Grade Level: Pre-K-3

Adapted from Leo Lionni's exquisitely crafted Caldecott Honor books, *Swimmy*, *Frederick*, and *Inch by Inch*, this beautiful production features innovative puppetry styles, imaginative lighting techniques and an original musical score. Your students will delight in the stories of *Swimmy*, the tiny fish who uses ingenuity to fend off danger; *Frederick*, a poetic mouse who makes everyday life an artful experience; and a lovable inchworm who shares his facility for measuring absolutely everything.

Kennedy Center Theater for Young Audiences on Tour

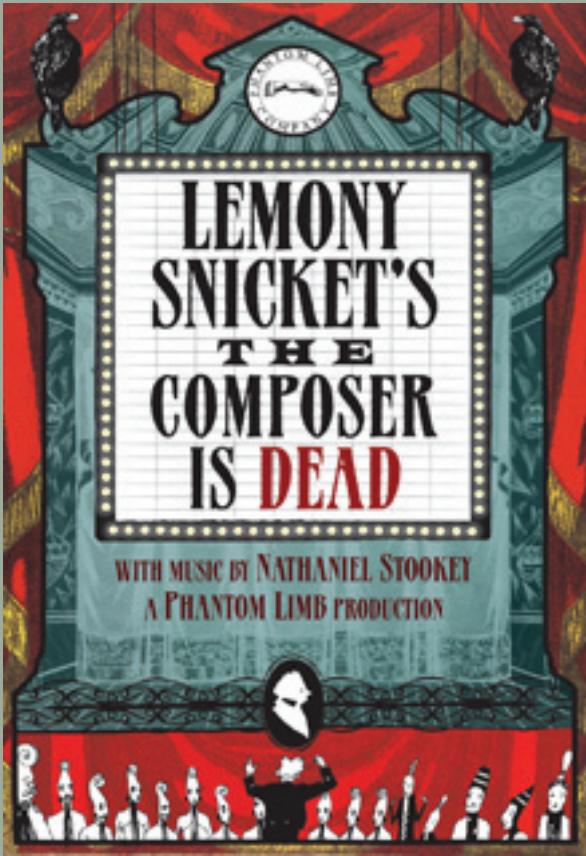
Recommended Grade Level: Pre-K-3

It sounds so simple, just a quick trip to the Laundromat with Daddy, Trixie and her beloved Knuffle Bunny. But before you know it, things go horribly, hilariously wrong. Chock full of adventure, song, and gigantic dancing laundry, *Knuffle Bunny* tells a tale of firsts: a stuffed animal's first trip to the laundry, a little girl's first words, and a Daddy's first time dealing with his child going "boneless." Based on his Caldecott Honor-winning picture book, Mo Willems adapts his adventure that lovingly celebrates the heart and heartache that can only come from a family visit to the Laundromat.



Lemony Snicket's The Composer Is Dead

Renowned children's author Lemony Snicket and the critically-acclaimed Phantom Limb Company join forces for this breathtaking theatrical adaptation of *The New York Times* best-selling picture book *The Composer is Dead*. There is a mystery to solve at Symphony Hall, and the suspects are all lurking somewhere onstage! Follow the Inspector as he interrogates each section of the orchestra. Where exactly were the violins on the night in question? Did anyone see the harp? Aren't the trumpets protesting a bit too boisterously? Every instrument is brought to life in this enchantingly uproarious musical mystery.

With plenty of audience participation and his wacky sense of humor, Beakman employs a series of large scale, fun, and visual demonstrations to illustrate how the brain works. Have you ever wondered how we think, feel, smell and see? What makes us cry, laugh, smile and sneeze? How our brains can get fooled – or the effect of music and art on our brains? Beakman will address the neuroscience of the brain in a fun, wacky and exploratory way for kids and adults alike. Be ready to be brain teased!

46 Circus Acts in 45 Minutes

Circa (Australia)

Recommended Grade Level: K-6

May 3-6, 2011

45 minute performance



You know how long you'll be there and how much fantastic circus you will see. Wherever Circa has taken it's breathtaking, heart-stopping show, audiences have flocked to see the impossible happen. Watch as four intrepid acrobats battle the clock to complete their quota of tricks. Marvel at the astounding ways they bend, fly, juggle and balance. Be dazzled by their skill. Set to upbeat music and featuring four multi-skilled performers, this is circus without the boring bits. Audiences will gasp at the knife juggling and the human yoyo; be astonished at the really strong guy and the hula hoop split; incredulous at the great ladder balance and the unicycle of death; and be helpless with laughter at the tumble splat and the great undie escape. And yes... there are 38 more acts followed by rapturous applause when 46 circus acts are completely completed in a mere 45 minutes.



Perô (or The Mysteries of the Night)

Recommended Grade Level: 1-8

In this beautifully touching love story, Perô the baker loves his friend, the laundress Colombina. She washes by the sun; he bakes by the moon. Because of their different lives, Colombina is convinced there can be no romance between them. One day, the painter Paletino appears, sweeping Colombina off her feet, and they go on a holiday. Perô's heart breaks and he stops baking. Colombina returns from holiday, and finding Paletino incompatible, hopes to win back her true love, Perô.



Room on the Broom

Tall Stories (United Kingdom)

Recommended Grade Level: 1-8

May 3-6, 2011

60 minute performance



Adapted from the bestselling book by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler, the Witch and her Cat are flying happily on a broomstick – until a stormy wind blows away the Witch’s hat, bow and wand. A helpful dog, bird and frog find the witch’s lost things, and they all hop on the broom for a ride. But – CRACK! SNAP! - this broomstick’s not meant for five. When a hungry dragon appears, who will save the poor witch? Will there ever be room on the broom for everyone?



Shopping for Shoes

Do you have students (ages 14-19) who take acting, dance or singing lessons? Who have appeared on stage in school or community productions? Who dream of going on to perform in college or even professionally? If you do, be sure to tell them about this camp! Cast and crew members from *Hairspray*, *Wicked* and *Jersey Boys* have led master classes for our past camps. This year we are proud to offer our 2010 camps with *THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA*. Each camp focuses on the triple threat of musical theater - acting, dancing and singing – and will include master classes led by the professionals. Students leave the camp with a professional headshot and résumé. Registration includes one ticket to a performance of *THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA*. Lunch is provided each day. Auditions are required for the Advanced Broadway Camp, and are scheduled for Sunday, May 23. Video submissions are also accepted.

School Performance Registration Policies and Procedures



REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Please complete the order form and retain a copy for your records. Mail your registration form to: School Performances, PlayhouseSquare, 1501 Euclid Avenue, Suite 200, Cleveland, OH 44115. Order forms can be faxed to 216-664-6069 (credit card and purchase orders only). Registration by phone is not accepted. Registration without payment cannot be accepted. The registration form acts as your contract. You will receive confirmation of your order within two weeks of receipt of your order and deposit.

CHAPERONES

For every 20 student seats purchased, one chaperone may attend free of charge. Additional adult seats may be purchased at the student rate to accommodate the teacher or chaperone requirements of your school.

PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS

Full payment or a 20% non-refundable deposit is required at the time of your registration. All registrations must be paid in full 30 days prior to the performance. Payments can be in the form of a check (school or personal), MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover. If these options are not available, a school purchase order is a legally binding document and due for the balance no later than 30 days prior to the performance. Invoices are sent to the school contact person listed on the registration form. Full payment or a purchase order from your Board of Education for the full balance must be submitted 30 days prior to your scheduled performance or your field trip may be cancelled. All purchase orders must be paid in full no later than 10 business days after your scheduled performance.

EARLY REGISTRATION (BEFORE SEPTEMBER 15)

PlayhouseSquare accepts EARLY registration from the day after Fair on the Square (April 27) through September 15, 2010. Early registrants receive one dollar off the regular ticket price IF an order form AND a 20% non-refundable deposit OR purchase order are received by September 15. Orders must be faxed or post-marked before or on September 15, 2010.

LATE REGISTRATION (WITHIN 30 DAYS)

PlayhouseSquare accepts registration up to the day before an event, based on availability. Purchase orders cannot be accepted for late registrations. Full payment or a 50% non-refundable deposit is required for all late registrations. If a 50% non-refundable deposit is made on late registrations, the full payment is due before the scheduled performance day. We reserve the right to cancel any reservation that is not paid in full before the performance date.

WAITING LISTS

We offer a waiting list for all sold-out performances. You will be notified at least 30 days before the performance date if space becomes available. We notify groups on the waiting list in the order in which registration forms were received.



REGISTRATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Ticket prices for school performances vary. A \$1.00 per ticket discount is applied to orders received on or before September 15, 2010. Members of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District may use the subsidized rate of \$2.75 per seat for specific afternoon school performances. The \$1.00 per ticket discount does not apply to the \$2.75 CMSD rate. Ticket prices for groups consisting of nine (9) or fewer people range from \$10-\$13. (Please see order forms for details.) The amount of tickets in your order can be adjusted up to 30 days prior to your scheduled performance, subject to availability.

INCLEMENT WEATHER/SNOW DAY POLICY

- ♦ If your school is closed due to inclement weather on the day of the scheduled performance, **please notify our office prior to show time.** Your school will receive credit toward a comparable performance within the same season.
- ♦ **You must contact PlayhouseSquare within seven (7) business days of your cancelled performance to receive your credit and schedule an alternate performance.**
- ♦ **NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER.**

TOURS

Tours of PlayhouseSquare are available for \$2.00 per student, for a maximum of 50 students per tour. Tours are appropriate for 3rd grade students and older. Tours are based on theater availability.

PICNIC-STYLE LUNCHES
