what had been lost and sorely missed in our schools. With her service to arts education, Colleen had accomplishments too numerous to mention and too impactful to measure, and she will be greatly missed by her PlayhouseSquare family and others who worked alongside her.

PlayhouseSquare commits \$1 million in fundraising each year to support our educational mission and we remain committed to doing so. Thanks to the generosity of so many, we are proud to continue Colleen's vision and continue the investment in our children, community and future, engaging and inspiring all audiences to become lifelong learners.

Ingenious performer Louis Lovett leads the audience on an untamed adventure that crosses snowy lands and wild seas. As Peggy desperately tries to save the day, we learn about love, loss, the reassurance of goats and the courage to sing gloriously on or off key.

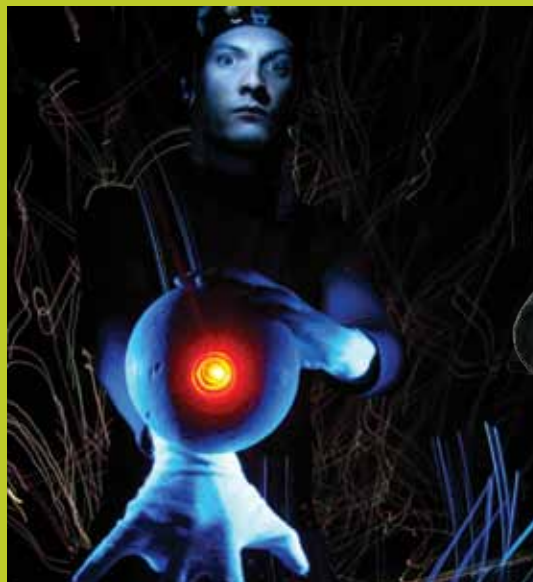
The Adventures of Alvin Sputnik: Deep Sea Explorer by Tim Watts

ZooZoo is penguins playing musical chairs, a cat trapped in a giant paper bag, hippos with insomnia, anteaters as waiters, and a madcap revue of illusion, comedy and fun that has inspired audiences nationwide. Imago has performed in China, Europe and at some of North America's most revered festivals.





partners *in* performance

Partners in Performance (PIP) was developed by the Community Engagement & Education Department at PlayhouseSquare as a reward for those school districts who consistently bring 15% of their student enrollment to see live performances through our Children's Theater Series for Schools, the International Children's Festival, or participate in arts education programs such as Careers in the Performing Arts, Discovering the Performing Arts or Slam field trips.

Becoming a Partner in Performance School District:

To qualify, school districts must book a field trip for at least 15% of their school district's total enrollment* by September 30. Each subsequent year in the program, districts are invited to enjoy additional rewards and benefits. To better serve our Partners, we have added a third phase to the program which allows PIP Districts to choose programs that better meet the needs of their individual school district.

** School enrollment numbers are calculated from total enrollment of prior year as posted by the Ohio Department of Education. All programs are based on availability and subject to change.*

Who dream of going on to perform in college or even professionally? If you do, be sure to tell them about this camp! Cast and crew members from *Hairspray*, *Wicked* and *The Phantom of the Opera* have led master classes for our past camps. We are proud to offer our 2012 camp with *Mamma Mia!* The camp focuses on the triple threat of musical theater – acting, dancing and singing – and will include master classes led by the professional performers from the national tour of *Mamma Mia!* This year, students will have the opportunity to learn scene work and acting techniques in small group sessions with local theater professionals. Students leave the camp with a professional headshot and résumé. Registration includes one ticket to a performance of *Mamma Mia!* Lunch is provided daily. 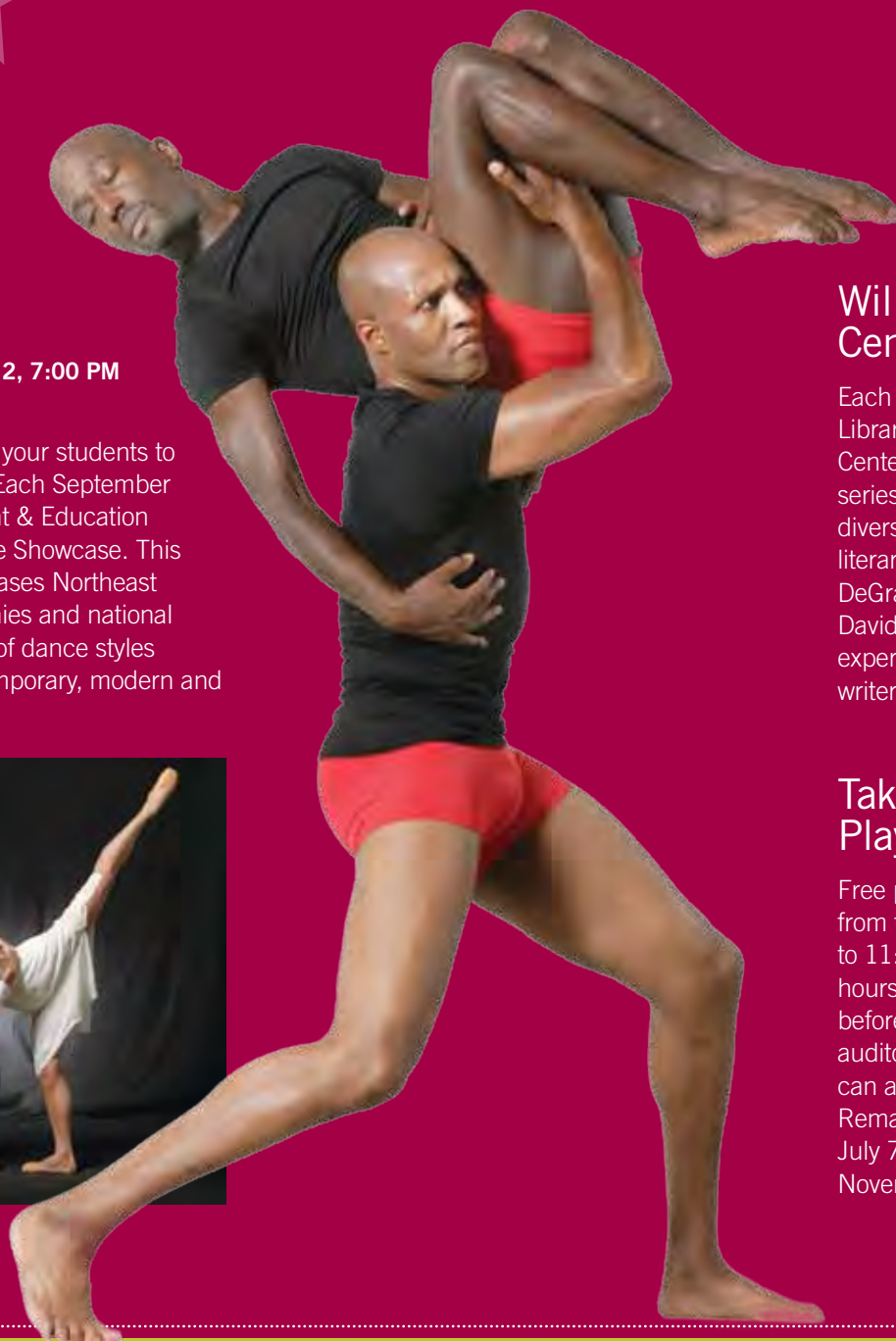

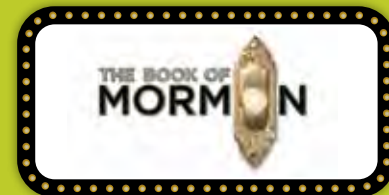

Registration Instructions

Please complete the order form and retain a copy for your records. Mail your registration form to: School Performances, PlayhouseSquare, 1501 Euclid Avenue, Suite 200, Cleveland, OH 44115. Order forms may be faxed to 216-664-6069 (credit card and purchase orders only). Registration by phone is not accepted. Registration without payment cannot be accepted. You will receive confirmation of your order within two weeks of receipt of your order and deposit.

Chaperones

For every 20 student seats purchased, one chaperone may attend free of charge. Additional adult seats may be purchased at the student rate to accommodate the teacher or chaperone requirements of your school.

Payment Instructions

A 20% non-refundable deposit is required at the time of your registration. All registrations must be paid in full 30 days prior to the performance. Payments can be in the form of a check (school or personal), MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover.

If these options are not available, a school purchase order is a legally binding document, which may be submitted in lieu of a deposit to secure your order, and is due for the balance in full no later than 30 days prior to the performance. Invoices are sent to the school contact person listed on the registration form. Full payment for the balance must be submitted 30 days prior to your scheduled performance or your field trip may be cancelled.

Early Registration (before September 30)

PlayhouseSquare accepts EARLY registration from the day after Fair on the Square (April 23) through September 30. Early registrants receive \$1.00 off the regular ticket price IF an order form AND a 20% non-refundable deposit OR purchase order are received by September 30. Orders must be faxed or post-marked before or on September 30.

Late Registration (within four weeks)

PlayhouseSquare accepts registration up to one week before an event, based on availability. Purchase orders cannot be accepted for late registrations. Full payment is required for all late registrations. We reserve the right to cancel any reservation that is not paid in full before the performance date.

Waiting Lists

We offer a waiting list for all sold-out performances. You will be notified at least four weeks before the performance date if space becomes available. We notify groups on the waiting list in the order in which registration forms were received.





Registration Policies and Procedures

Ticket prices for school performances may vary. A \$1.00 per ticket discount is applied to orders received on or before September 30. Members of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District may use the subsidized rate of \$3.00 per seat for noon school performances. The \$1.00 per ticket discount does not apply to the \$3.00 CMSD rate. Ticket prices for groups consisting of nine (9) or fewer people range from \$10-\$11. (Please see order forms for details.) The amount of tickets in your order can be adjusted up to 30 days prior to your scheduled performance, subject to availability.

Inclement Weather/Snow Day Policy

- If your school is closed due to inclement weather on the day of the scheduled performance, please notify our office prior to show time. Your school will receive credit toward a comparable performance within the same season.
- You must contact PlayhouseSquare within seven (7) business days of your cancelled performance to receive your credit and schedule an alternate performance.
- NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER.

Picnic-Style Lunches

If you choose to participate in the PlayhouseSquare picnic-style lunch program, please be aware of the following:

- Only Partners in Performance schools are eligible to stay for a picnic-style lunch and must make lunch reservations when shows are ordered due to limited space.
- On the day of your field trip, please arrive at least 15 minutes early so that bag lunches can be collected before entry into the theater.
- Bag lunches will be re-distributed to students just before lunch.
- Please make sure that each student's lunch is clearly labeled with the following: student's name, teacher's name, homeroom number and school name.
- Collect all of the students' lunches and box them by homeroom number.

We are happy to provide space for your class to participate in a picnic-style lunch and we appreciate your cooperation with the above requirements.

IMPORTANT: Due to the nature of the entertainment industry, all performances, dates and times listed in this catalog are subject to change without notice.

- For assistance in choosing the best shows for your class, call 216-348-7909.
- All performances for schools are approximately one hour in length, unless otherwise noted.
- Please remember that the House Manager is here to assist you before, during and after your school performance.
- Inappropriate behavior may result in disciplinary action or suspension from school performances for one year.
- Home schools are required to submit certification with ticket orders. All members of home school parties must have a ticket for admission.
- No children under age two at school performances.
- NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED FOR CHANGES IN ENROLLMENT OR STUDENTS WHO ARE ABSENT THE DAY OF THE PERFORMANCE.

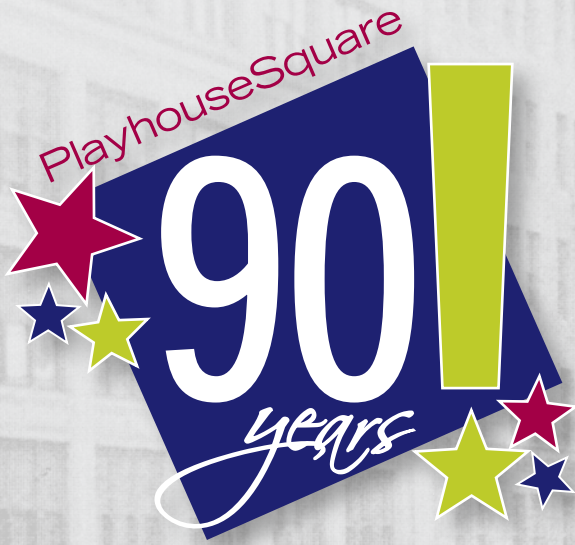
