June	16	1956	"You're the Apple of My Eye," The Four Lovers first release, peaks at #62 on Billboard's Top 100
September	15	1962	"Sherry" hits #1 on the Billboard Hot 100, remains #1 for 5 weeks (GOLD)
October	13	1962	The Four Seasons on the cover of Cash Box Magazine with "Sherry"
November	17	1962	"Big Girls Don't Cry" hits #1 on the Billboard Hot 100, remains #1 for 5 weeks (GOLD)
December	9	1962	The Four Seasons appear on the Ed Sullivan Show for the first time
December	15	1962	The Four Seasons unique cover of "Santa Claus is Coming to Town" released, peaks at #23 on the Billboard Hot 100
February	22	1963	The Four Seasons appear on American Bandstand
March	2	1963	"Walk Like a Man" hits # 1 on the Billboard Hot 100, remains #1 for 3 weeks (GOLD)
July	6	1963	"Candy Girl" released, peaks at #3 on the Billboard Hot 100
February	1	1964	"Dawn (Go Away)" released, peaks at #3 and remains at #3 for 3 weeks
February	15	1964	"Stay" released, peaks at #16 on the Billboard Hot 100
April	11	1964	"Ronnie" released, peaks at #6 on the Billboard Hot 100
July	18	1964	"Rag Doll" hits # 1 on the Billboard Hot 100, remains #1 for 2 weeks (GOLD)
October	1	1964	The Beatles vs. The Four Seasons album released
November	7	1964	"Big Man in Town" released, peaks at #20 on the Billboard Hot 100
December	9	1964	The Four Seasons appear on Top of the Pops in the UK
January	16	1965	"Bye Bye Baby (Baby Goodbye)" released, peaks at #12 on the Billboard Hot 100
October	9	1965	"Let's Hang On!" released, peaks at #3 on the Billboard Hot 100 (GOLD)
January	2	1966	The Four Seasons appear on The Ed Sullivan Show for the second time
January	29	1966	"Working My Way Back to You" released, peaks at #9 on the Billboard Hot 100
May	21	1966	"Opus 17 (Don't You Worry 'Bout Me)" released, peaks at #13 on the Billboard Hot 100
October	2	1966	The Four Seasons appear on The Ed Sullivan show for the third time
October	4	1966	The Four Seasons make a second appearance on The Ed Sullivan Show
March	4	1967	"Beggin" released, peaks at #15 on the Billboard Hot 100
June	10	1967	"C'mon Mariane" released, peaks at #9 on the Billboard Hot 100
July	29	1967	"Can't Take My Eyes Off You" released, peaks at #2 on the Billboard Hot 100 (GOLD)
March	22	1975	"My Eyes Adored You" hits #1 on the Billboard Hot 100; Frankie Valli's first number one hit as a solo artist
August	23	1975	"Who Loves You" released, peaks at #3 on the Billboard Hot 100
February	21	1976	"December, 1963 (Oh, What a Night)" hits #1 on the UK singles chart
March	13	1976	"December, 1963 (Oh, What a Night)" hits #1 on the Billboard Hot 100, remains #1 for 3 weeks
August	26	1978	"Grease" by Frankie Valli hits #1 on the Billboard Hot 100
January	17	1990	The Four Seasons inducted into the Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame
January	3	1995	Frankie Valli appears in an episode of "Full House", playing himself
December	24	2000	Nick Massi passed away
March	28	2004	Frankie Valli makes his first appearance as Rusty Millio on "The Sopranos"
August	28	2005	The <i>Jersey Boys</i> Original Broadway Cast cuts the cast album, produced by Bob Gaudio. The album wins the 2007 Grammy Award for Best Musical Show Album and is certified GOLD.
November	6	2005	<i>Jersey Boys</i> opens on Broadway at the August Wilson (formerly Virginia) Theatre
June	11	2006	<i>Jersey Boys</i> wins 4 Tony Awards, including Best Musical
December	10	2006	<i>Jersey Boys</i> First National Tour opens in San Francisco, CA at the Curran Theatre
October	14	2007	<i>Jersey Boys</i> Chicago opens at the LaSalle Bank Theatre
October	16	2007	<i>Jersey Boys: The Story of Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons</i> , the official behind-the-scenes companion book to the musical, is released by Broadway Books with an initial printing of 85,000 copies
March	18	2008	<i>Jersey Boys</i> London opens at the Prince Edward Theatre
May	3	2008	<i>Jersey Boys</i> Las Vegas opens at the Palazzo Hotel-Resort-Casino
